Standing Strong Together Despite Cosmic Bootcamp

When I became executive director two years ago – on April Fool's Day – it's a good thing I had no idea of the economic firestorm that was coming our collective way (although starting on a Fool's Day should have been a big tip off). I'm feeling like we are all in a cosmic bootcamp.

The thing about a firestorm is that nothing is left unchanged in its path. And this is true of Wellspring too. We've made a lot of changes here in order to meet the rising tide of need and still pay the bills. And we have delivered. With your financial gifts we served more people last year, over 2,400, than ever before in our 29 year history. We squeezed every dollar we received to do more.

The Board of Directors gathered together and we took stock. We had to. Only one thing was clear last spring when we dug in on a budget for this year – we couldn't afford to continue to offer all of our programs. So we analyzed, talked, and stayed grounded in the spirit that had brought us all together in the first place. We considered the needs of the community and

our resources and experience. What was the work that would allow us to make the most significant contribution to the community and those struggling in poverty?

We affirmed that we will not abandon the most vulnerable among us. Wellspring House continues to shelter homeless families, offer homeless prevention assistance, holiday meals and the holiday store, and advocate and provide for affordable housing.

Recognizing that education is essential to help low-income families break out of poverty, we also affirmed that we would **invest in our education and job training programs**. Years of working with low-income adults has helped us

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FROM DROP OUT TO HOT PROSPECTS...

When James Haskell enrolled in Wellspring's Adult Learning Initiative in the Fall of 2009 he was an out of work lobsterman who had dropped out of high school. Without a diploma Jamie couldn't even apply for most jobs or school, and his dream of becoming a Harley-Davidson mechanic was a very distant prospect. By the time he graduated from ALI in December 2009, Jamie's dream had taken a new shape. He promptly passed his GED and was accepted into the National Aviation Academy. Here's an update from him – one year later.

"I am scheduled for my general aviation mechanic's license written test and I have already passed my airframe test last week! I just started the "Powerplant" section of my school and only have 7 months left until graduation. I have been competing for the top of my class with my classmate and good friend Josh who has already worked in the aviation field for the Airforce for ten years. I've also been talking to recruiters
