



### Wellspring's Holiday Store Now in its 21st Year!

Each December, for one weekend before the holidays, Wellspring is stocked with donated toys, books and gift cards for eligible low-income parents to shop by appointment for their children.

Last holiday season, Wellspring's Holiday Store served 804 children from 344 families on Cape Ann and beyond. This program not only brightens the holidays for kids in need, it also serves as a lifeline keeping parents from getting behind on bills or rent in January.

This year, our Holiday Store will be held on Saturday, December 9th and Sunday, December 10th. Please consider making a child's holiday and easing the financial burden on those in need by heading up a toy drive or making a financial contribution. Churches, book groups, dinner clubs and birthday parties are great places to get started. Also a perfect service project for your student.

# MORE THAN 40 KIDS RETURNED TO SCHOOL PREPARED THANKS TO WELLSPRING SUPPORTERS

The start of a new school year brings excitement, anticipation and the added financial cost of back to school shopping. A new backpack can cost upwards of fifty dollars. Combined with school supplies, the total can become a real burden to household budgets that are already stretched.

Thankfully again this year, Wellspring's families — from shelter guests and case management clients to MediClerk students — got a much needed boost in the form of backpacks and school supplies from our friends at Cornerstone Church in Manchester, Saint Paul's Church in Hamilton, and Cross Fit Cape Ann, as well



as our corporate partner Garnet Hill. Cornerstone Church and Saint Paul's donated brand new hand-picked and hand-packed backpacks filled with supplies. Cross Fit Cape Ann donated school supplies, and Garnet Hill donated thirty colorful, brand new backpacks from their fall line.

#### **OUR MISSION**

Wellspring House empowers individuals and families to live more secure lives through basic needs assistance, education and job training.


#### **EDUCATION & JOB TRAINING**

- 268 students participated in our education programs: the Adult Learning Initiative, English Language Learning, MediClerk job training, and our new Wellspring Education Resource Center (WERC)
- 6 students received grant awards totaling \$8,350 from the Robert Clarke Rogers Educational Opportunity Fund.
- 2 students were sponsored by Wellspring to participate in the One Family Scholars program.

#### **BASIC NEEDS WORK**

- 14 homeless families were housed in Wellspring's Family Shelter.
- 32 remaining homeless families living in a motel shelter (now closed) were placed in permanent housing
- 56 homeless families living in a motel shelter (now closed) received housing search services.
- 34 formerly homeless families received follow-up care after moving into their new homes.
- 312 callers to our Homeless Prevention Hotline received referrals and assistance.
- 17 families received grants totaling \$22,367 from Small Can Be Big and Wellspring's Homelessness Prevention Fund to help avoid homelessness and keep their homes.
- 56 children received back to school backpacks and supplies.
- 804 children from 344 families were served by our Holiday Store.
- 12 low-income single adults lived in our lodging house their permanent home.

Thanks to a generous donor, Wellspring House will be the beneficiary of proceeds from the sale of a private art collection.

Frank Robinson, a long-time friend of Wellspring House, explains why he decided to make this magnanimous offer:

Prior to retiring I was and actually still am an architectural designer [I've been a dismal failure at this retirement business!].



Currently I'm going through a major down-sizing, giving me an opportunity to unload a bunch of art for Wellspring's benefit now. Why wait? I have a compulsion to collect visual items that please me. I have done this by visiting artists in their studios, attending gallery openings and craft shows, locally and while traveling here and abroad. This started in high school, with my first oil painting been purchased in 1950. The bulk of my collecting covered the period from the late 50's through 2000's. I've tried to stop, another failure on my part. Items are sculpture in wood, metal and ceramics, paintings in oil, acrylic, watercolor and prints of various types, all in both functional and abstract.
