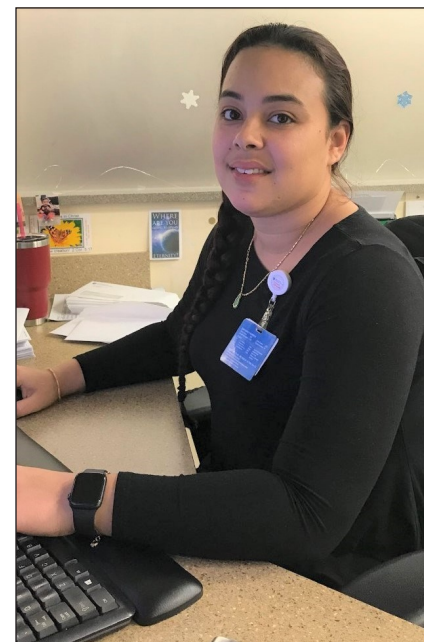

The WCE MediClerk Training Program is open to residents of the North Shore and surrounding communities who:

- Have a high school diploma or GED (HiSET)
- Are available Monday through Friday 8:30 am-3:30 pm for the entire 15-week session
- Have basic computer skills and typing experience (25 words per minute)
- Elect to take and pass a Criminal Offender Record Investigation (CORI).
- Possess authorization to work in the U.S. and have an employment goal
- All applicants MUST first participate in a MediClerk information session.

Tuition is \$3,900
Income-based tuition assistance is readily available on a sliding scale. Please contact us to discuss options.

LEARN

The WCE MediClerk Training Program is designed to provide the necessary skills to secure and succeed in an administrative position in the healthcare field.

- Courses offered during each 15-week session include:
- Medical Terminology
 - Medical Office Procedures
 - MS Word/Excel/PowerPoint/Outlook
 - Business Communications
 - Medical Keyboarding
 - Professional Success
 - Goals/Job Search Skills

Students also learn on the job through job-shadowing and working internships at North Shore Medical Center, North Shore Physician's Group and other area healthcare facilities.

WCE MediClerk Training Program graduates qualify for consideration for entry-level positions in the healthcare field including:

- Patient Registration
- Unit Secretary
- Medical Records Clerk
- Financial Counselor/Billing
- Receptionist/Secretary

GROW

Graduates receive career counseling and support after graduation.

Upon completion of the program, graduates are eligible for up to 19 credits at North Shore Community College to advance their education!
